Metacognition

Metacognition is an individual's ability to identify their current thought process and select helpful strategies to tackle challenges more effectively. It is often divided into three parts – before, during and after a task. Research suggests that metacognition is one of the most effective and cost efficient ways to help pupils make gains in their learning.

Metacognition is much more than just 'thinking about thinking' or 'learning how to learn'...

What is metacognition?

Metacognition is the ability to reflect and critically analyse how you think. Essentially, it is best thought of as having self-awareness that enables individuals to monitor, reflect and analyse their performance. Pupils who can do this are more likely to learn more efficiently and more effectively and therefore make additional progress.
