Metacognition and goal-setting

Setting and reviewing goals is one of the most significant ways that a pupil can make and monitor progress. This can be done by setting both short- and long-term goals, ensuring they are both challenging and realistic, and also placing a strong emphasis on skill development as well as on outcome. Metacognition and Feedback can be one of the best ways to help someone improve their learning, yet research suggests that 38% of feedback interventions actually do more harm than good. Making feedback an integral part of the learning process is a key way to encourage metacognition in the classroom. Teachers should create an environment in which pupils appreciate that feedback from the task at hand is not a judgement on who they are as a person.


