

This is how we promote British Values in our Year Three Class at Brownlow Fold Primary School



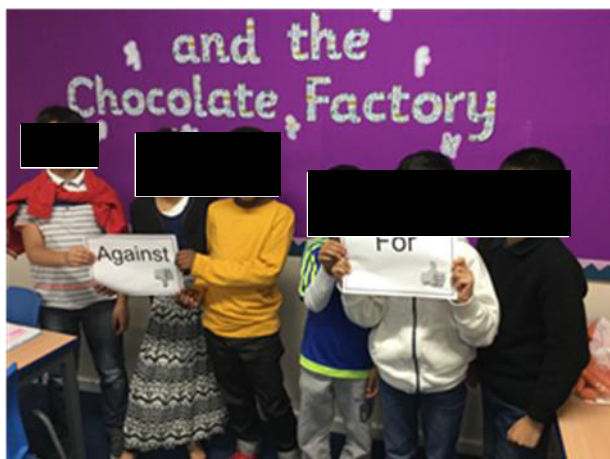
Year Three

Democracy

Each week the children vote for someone who they think deserves to be the classmate of the week. The child with the most votes receives a certificate and eats their dinner on the Top Table the following Monday.

The class behaviour system has a range of different rewards. In September the children discussed what they would like their rewards to be and then voted for their favourite ideas.

Year 3 wrote balanced arguments and as part of the process we took part in debates and discussions.



The rule of law

In Year 3 there is a display that the children regularly interact with to ensure that they are following the school rules. This display also reinforces the rewards and consequences if the school rules are not followed.

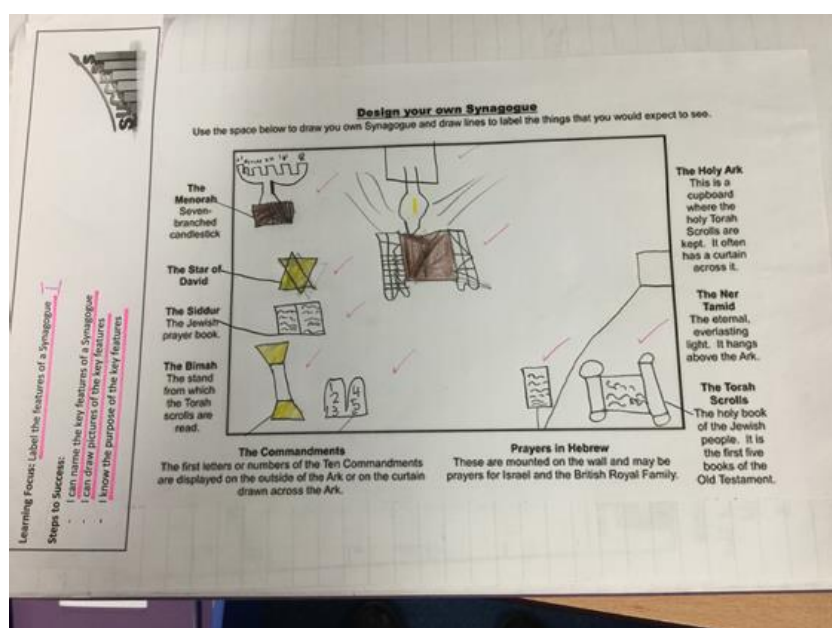
During the autumn term year 3 were visited by police officers who demonstrated the role of the police and the PCSOs in the local area. They spoke to the children about dangers that they may face and what to do in an emergency.

Individual liberty

Each Friday Year 3 sit together and each child has the opportunity to tell us about / discuss something of their choice. The children look forward to this and it is a great time for the children and adults to get to know more about each other.

Mutual respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs and for those without faith

In Year 3 the children learn about a range of different faiths through their R.E. lessons. The children enjoy these lessons and are keen to take part in discussions and look at how different religions link to their own beliefs. Last half term the children learned about Judaism.



Different faiths are also promoted during assemblies, with a weekly assembly being led by someone from the church. The children also learned about Diwali during the autumn term in assembly.
